Overview of FY27 ESEA Application

The application is organized into projects. We have one project (brief description below). We received less funds for FY27 because the state changed the way they allocate Title 1 funds and only count those students whose families are on Direct Certification (TANF, Snap, EBT) rather than those who qualify for Free and/or Reduced Rates for nutrition programs.

Project – School-Wide Program
Goals # 1& 2 – Increase literacy and mathematics achievement as demonstrated by ME Through Year Assessment from spring 2025 - spring 2026. Funds go into the schoolwide project to pay for professional development, training, salaries for the after-school program, and some materials/supplies. Goal #3 Decrease chronic absenteeism rates. Over the course of the year, we had 3 students who were chronically absent during their time at AES.

This ensures that all unexpended Federal Title I, Part A funds remain fully available to support targeted academic interventions and continuous school improvement without penalty.

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
